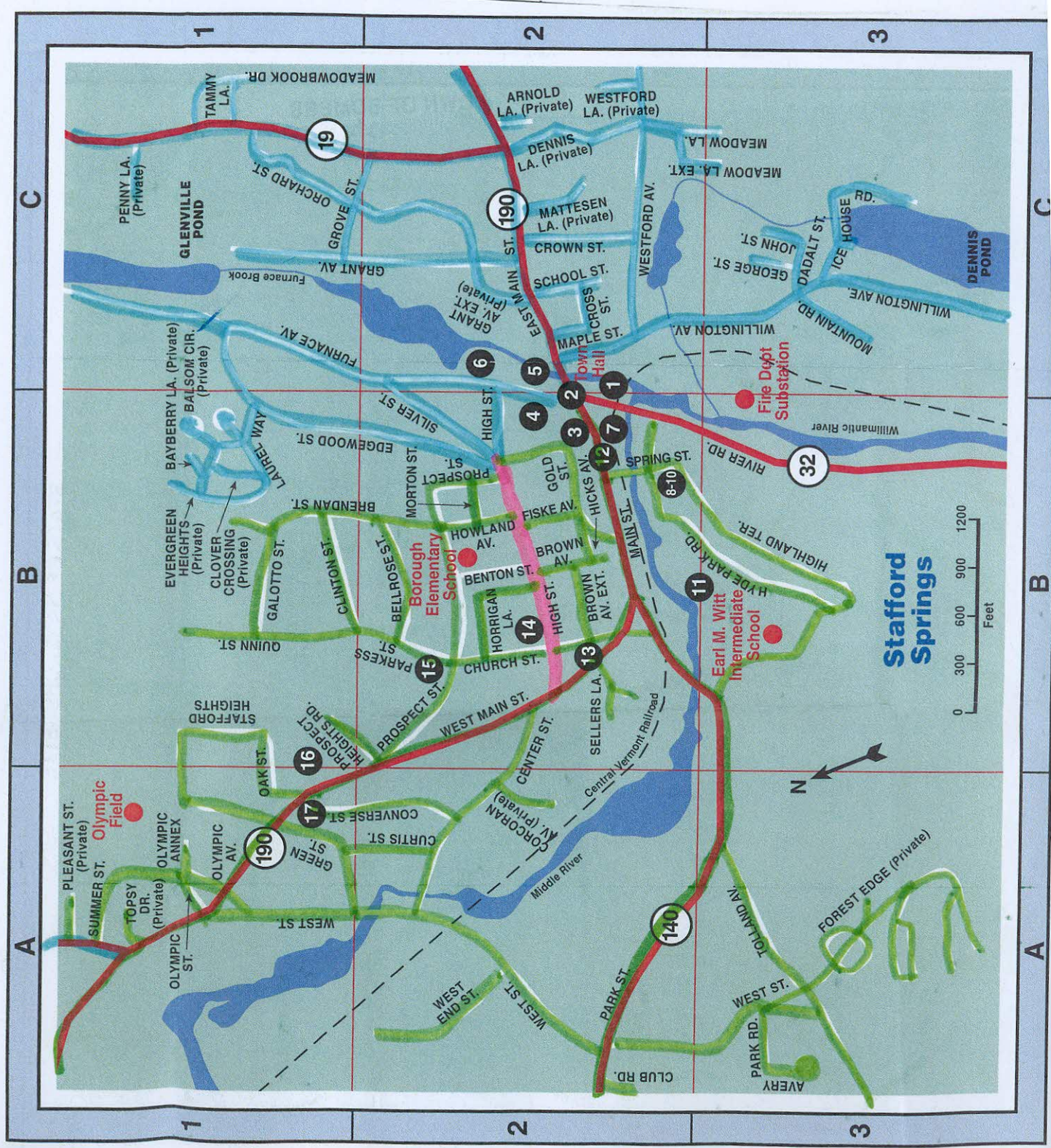

**HAYMARKET COMMON** - Main Street. Established in 1983, it is one of Stafford's newest revitalization projects.

**FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH** - Church Street. The original chapel was built in 1844 and the building enlarged in 1844. A secret near the belfrey was discovered in 1979. The church is a fine example of Gothic Revival architecture with a coal stove, various antique items, and a direct opening to the basement to raise or lower the floor. The Johnson Organ, Opus 541, circa 1870 and the stenciling in the sanctuary are worthy.

**SAINT EDWARD THE CONFESSOR R.C. CHURCH** - 55 High Street. Construction was completed in 1866 using stone from a local quarry. The church was dedicated on March 10, 1868. Two towers and the wings were finished in 1895. The school was started in 1874.

**BARON PARKES HOUSE** - 56 Prospect Street. Built circa 1790, this is the oldest house in Stafford Springs.

**HOLY TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH** - West Main Street. This existing building was built by the congregation, remodeled, and the cornerstone laid on August 6, 1922. Until the 1950s, all church services were in Slovak. It was until the 1950s that English services were
